Faced with an ageing flatbed inkjet press nearing the end of its life, Color Ink sought a modern, efficient wide-format replacement to help maintain its competitive edge and continue delivering high-quality and high-volume results. Adding to the wide-format fleet was crucial, especially given the needs of its structural design team and its inherent focus on producing eye-catching POP displays and converting flat substrate cardboard into vibrant, dimensional presentations.

In February of 2024, the Canon team delivered a seamless installation of the Texas, helping Color Ink to quickly integrate the new printer into their operations. Austin praised the technical support and service teams for providing minimal downtime and effective troubleshooting, enabling more efficient job scheduling and reducing the load on other devices.

Texas-sized Results

The Texas LT/X2 has made a large imprint on Color Ink's operations, with its highly productive, stationary flatbed that is capable of more than 3,000 ft²/hour (greater than 60 boards/hour). Its spacious five feet by ten feet image area accommodates substrates up to six inches thick, producing excellent output with meticulous detail and vivid color.

"THE TEXAS IS EASILY—AND THIS IS PROBABLY CONSERVATIVE—TWICE AS FAST (AS OUR PREVIOUS PRINTER). A JOB THAT WAS 40 SHEETS THAT TAKES SAY AN HOUR ON THE TEXAS WOULD HAVE TAKEN TWO HOURS. SO, IF YOU EXTRAPOLATE THAT OVER ALL THE IMPRESSIONS, YOU CAN PUT SOME NUMBERS BEHIND THAT AND MAKE ASSUMPTIONS ON WHAT AN HOURLY RATE IS FOR AN OPERATOR." – Austin Meissner

According to Austin, the Texas printer has reduced ink consumption by 30 percent compared to their previous printer. Austin attributes this to a combination of significantly lower waste ink from head purges and a higher ink yield, resulting in less ink being used per square foot.

Additionally, the streamlined workflow has been enhanced by the printer's registration pin system for accurate board loading and a two-zone vacuum table that holds media firmly in place. The reversable airflow system allows for easy board removal, and the auto unloader feature enables operators to focus strictly on loading sheets, helping to further enhance productivity. Austin said this efficiency of the auto unloader has saved operators approximately 15 seconds between sheets without the need to stack printed sheets manually. Over an eight-hour shift, this can culminate in roughly up to 80 minutes of productivity gains.

Quality and Flexibility Redefined

With the Texas LT/X2 maintaining high standards even at faster speeds, efficiency and quality have been a hallmark for Color Ink. The machine's TruFire Precision Print System helps to ensure dot placement accuracy, reliability, and productivity.

"THE OTHER DEVICES THAT ARE OUT THERE THAT ARE IN THAT COMPETING SPACE TO THE TEXAS TOUT A SIMILAR NUMBER OF BOARDS PER HOUR AND THAT'S FINE. MAYBE RUNNING AT TOP SPEED AND YOUR LOWEST QUALITY MODE, YOU CAN GET THE SAME NUMBER OF BOARDS AND THAT'S GREAT. BUT IT'S NOT GREAT IF YOU CAN'T SELL IT, RIGHT? IF THE QUALITY IS NOT GOOD ENOUGH FOR THE CUSTOMERS TO ACCEPT IT, IT DOESN'T REALLY MATTER HOW MANY BOARDS AN HOUR YOU CAN PUT THROUGH. WHAT I NOTICED ABOUT THE TEXAS IS THAT IN THE STANDARD MODE OR ITS SPEED MODE, IT'S PROBABLY PRODUCING MORE SELLABLE SHEETS THAN SOME OF THE OTHER COMPETING DEVICES." – Austin Meissner

This balance has had a significant impact on Color Ink's operators, supporting their ability to satisfy client requests with a minimal learning curve. The device's marginal downtime and quick startup times, especially during shift transitions, have set the team up for continuous success. Austin said daily maintenance has decreased to just 10 minutes per day compared to their previous device that required one to two hours of maintenance each day, which has supported a seamless experience.

A Future Focused on Growth

Color Ink's utilization of the Texas LT/X2 has exemplified their legacy of innovation and commitment to quality, empowering the team to enhance production capabilities, meet evolving client needs, and maintain a leading position in the commercial print industry.

As Color Ink continues its customer-first journey, advanced technology will help them expand into new markets and enhance both capacity and capability. Upcoming technologies, including an even more efficient version of the Texas printer and the Canon varioPRESS iV7 B2 inkjet production device, has Austin excited for the possibilities of Color Ink's future.
